WHO WE ARE

The Interagency Supply Chain Group (ISG) is an initiative that brings together experts from the global health procurement and supply chain management (PSM) community to improve their supply chain performance and drive better health outcomes in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).

The ISG has expanded to include participation from all disease verticals and across PSM technical areas to foster collaboration, integrate related workstreams, and develop cross-disease strategies and tools.

With this viewpoint as the only crosscutting initiative, the ISG helps identify gaps in support, prioritize interagency resources, and tie together technical activities to help realize a long-term global health PSM vision.
